<sup>\*</sup> Segregation of toys into different age groups to suitably match toys with the needs of children-Over time, we started realizing that we are receiving lots of board games which can be very interactive and can be used for underprivileged kids who are studying in slum schools and other orphanages etc., where they can play with them under adult supervision. So we started connecting with them.

Our awareness-action campaign picked up pace within just a few days as people from different parts of Mumbai started responding to our aggressive publicity campaign through pamphlets and social media sites like Facebook (<a href="https://www.facebook.com/smile.scout/">https://www.facebook.com/smile.scout/</a>) and Instagram. Preliminary surveys revealed a large potential for the success of our campaign among the well-off strata of society, most of which had old toys lying that were in good condition for donation to street children. The creation of our awareness-cum-mobile app at <a href="www.giftsmiles.co.in">www.giftsmiles.co.in</a> allowed us to receive donation requests from people across town. In Mumbai alone, 4 core smile scouts collected <a href="over140">over 140</a>

toys from approx. 65 donors. We covered the pick-ups primarily from our residential localities and our school to begin with. Later, we started receiving response from people from other parts of the city as well. The success of our mobile app was well visible as about 65% of responses were received with the help of the mobile app.

Our regular pleas for donation during Diwali festival were answered actively as we collected over 80 old and new toys during the festival holidays alone. One of our generous donor was so moved that she gifted us 40 old toys from her twin kids' collection. These toys were then distributed, as in the table.

#### Campaign hits whole of the country- Breaks cross cultural background

- We received response from a school in a tribal town in Rajasthan Dungarpur Public School'. The principal of the school replicated the campaign in his school with the help of our mobile app. With a large tribal population in the town, children of this Public school collected over 20 toys in their first run and gifted then to a deaf and dumb school in the town. A primary teacher opted to be the smile scout for this town and children gave very hearty and welcoming response to this mission. We have received pictures, videos regarding this campaign and letter of appreciation from the school.
- Along with this Mrs Vibha Gupta an entrepreneur opted to be out Bangalore Smile Scout.
   She started this campaign in her locality and within few days, she started getting request for toys pick up from her locality. She collected over 25 toys from her locality and distributed to the needy kids. We have pictures of this campaign received from her.
- Soon enough we added another smile Scout "A fitness trainer" a person from a lower middle class family in Dadar Mumbai. He agreed to support with collection and donation in slums. He collected 10 toys from his wadi and in turn we passed him 10 games for the kids making paper lantern in his wadi. We have pictures and videos received from him.
- We received new toys through amazon from our hearty donors from Bangalore and pune, who fulfilled the wish lists posted by us on our facebook page. We received about 10 video games, a binocular and some spinning tops.
- We had a big win when Lions Club International acknowledged our campaign -they will use
  our portal to collect toys and games for the kids and will club the campaign with their other
  social projects for kids. Their request for modification of app structure to suit their needs is
  under way. We have received a letter from them.

**RESULT** -Over all due to this campaign about **65 donors have donated over 140 toys in Mumbai alone**. From 4 smile scouts in Mumbai, we are now 7 smile scouts in India and many more ready to join us. Our 3 new smile scouts in other part of country have collected over 60 toys making a tally over 200. In nutshell, **200 street children received smiles through 7 smile scouts within a period of 1 month of active execution of this campaign.**







